

Community Governance Review Initial Consultation Document

Introduction

At its Full Council meeting held on 16 July 2025, the Council approved both the undertaking of a Borough wide Community Governance Review and the Terms of Reference for the Review.

The first stage of the Review is an initial consultation with stakeholders to collate their views on potential amendments to parish arrangements. The Council will use responses to the initial consultation to help it formulate formal draft recommendations which will be published in December 2025.

A further public consultation will then take place on the draft proposals before the final recommendations of the Review are published in February 2026. The final recommendations will then be submitted to Full Council at its meeting on 25 March 2026.

This document should be read alongside the Review's Terms of Reference which outlines the principles that the Council will consider when formulating its recommendations.

These can be summarised as follows:

- Viability – parishes should be able to actively and effectively serve their residents and contribute to the provision of services in their areas.
- Creation of new parishes – the Council intends for the whole of its area to be parished, where at all feasible.
- Boundaries – should be easily identifiable and should, where possible, reflect the 'no man's land' between communities. The area to which an address is postally addressable will also be considered when determining boundaries.
- Grouping of parishes – where two or more parishes are grouped together under a common parish council. This will be considered in areas where there are small parishes that might otherwise be unviable as separate units.
- Naming – the Council will consider proposals to amend the geographical name of a parish but will endeavour to reflect existing local or historic place names.
- Council size – the Council intends to use the National Association of Local Councils' (NALC) framework on council size, unless there is strong evidence of one or more of the mitigating factors outlined in the Terms of Reference.
- Parish warding – where a parish is split between two or more Borough Ward or County Divisions, the Council will ward the parish in line with Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE) guidance. Where this isn't the case, the Council will consider warding the parish where there is evidence that the number or distribution of electors warrants it or where there is a strong local feeling that it would be desirable for specific areas of the parish to be separately represented on the council.

This document outlines potential amendments for each parish in the Borough based on the above principles. At this stage, they are not formal proposals – the Council is simply seeking stakeholders' views in order to help it formulate the Review's formal draft recommendations.

Stakeholders are encouraged to read this document and then complete the accompanying survey by **8 October 2025** in order to help the Council shape the formal draft recommendations that are put forward. Responders to the survey can give their views on as few or as many parishes as they would like to.
